The research also indicates that BSN holders have higher proficiency in making proper diagnoses.²

Greater Responsibility and Higher Pay

Although some employers simply pay BSN-RNs more than their ADN or diploma counterparts, the higher salary also results from a greater level of clinical and non-clinical responsibility that BSN-RNs are qualified to hold. As of May 2018, RNs in the U.S. earned an annual median salary of **\$71,730**, with the top 10 percent earning more than **\$96,320**.³
